Current Business – Continued

- **Due to winter break, the January NEOMED Student Council (NSC) meeting will be January 8th instead of January 1st**
 - **Student Organization Spring budget submissions will still be due on January 1st via Presence**
 - **At the January 8th NSC meeting, the council will hear event and presentation requests that occur on or after January 15th**
- **Due to spring break, the March NEOMED Student Council (NSC) meeting will be March 11th instead of March 4th**
 - **At the March 11th NSC meeting, the council will hear event and presentation requests that occur on or after March 18th**
- Recommendations from Conference Services to reduce the risk of running out of food on the buffets:
 - Conference Services will update the menus to indicate what the portion sizes are for the catered items. This way an organizer can plan their order accordingly.
 - The event organizer can decide to provide a sign at the buffet stating how much a guest can take of each item. We do this at a few student events already.
 - Conference Services can serve the items to the group for a minimal charge or the organizer can identify a staff member that can portion out the buffet for no charge. Many external groups request this to cut back on food charges.
 - A Conference Service staff member will be in attendance at every event from start to finish so if a possible problem is identified they can react immediately and resolve the issue so we do not have to call or e-mail with concerns.
- Update re-eligibility changes for officers of NSC, Student Curriculum Council, Student Conduct Council, and Board of Trustees (BOT) student members:
 - NSC and Student Conduct Council have approved revised language to their officer eligibility
 - Revised language that further defines eligibility requirements for student members of the NEOMED Board of Trustees will remain under consideration for the future, but will not be presented to the Board of Trustees for approval at this time

Class Concerns

October 2019

- COG – No concerns
- M4 – Students expressed the desire to choose who hoods them at commencement. The issues and the commencement summary was presented to the new president who weighed in on the details and Student Services will be sending out an update re hooding and commencement details to all graduates in the coming month.
- P4 – No concerns
- M3 – All student records are being transferred from ImmunU to CastleBranch by Student Services. The charge for continuing students was reduced to \$10 instead of \$27 by CastleBranch and will cover lifetime immunization record management. For continuing students, only the TB and flu must be uploaded. There is difficulty finding schedules for ACM with the new AIMS update. Students have limited information about expectations and timelines. Dean Pokorny will follow up with the communication regarding the organization of ACM.
- P3 – Students are concerned with scheduling for posting. Dr. Paxos said he is willing to meet with people due to outside circumstances (rotations, etc.)
- M2 – A student suggested that there be an online sign-up sheet for NEW center rooms, so students may check this before studying in rooms which meetings will be happening. An online location where all NEW room events (faculty/student/staff/etc.) are listed by date and time. This can be done on outlook right now. Go to Scheduling Assistant to view what rooms are open. However, you are not permitted to schedule your own study time in these rooms.
- P2 – People are driving too fast and not paying attention in the parking lots. Speed bumps were suggested, but issues arise with plowing in the winter months making this option infeasible. Security will continue to ticket speeders, and walkers should be cautious using cross walks and side walks where available. Concerns about the temperature in MDL for lecture. However, the heat can not be turned up in MDL due to biohazard safety. Great Hall is nearly completed.
- M1 – Some students are having issues with syncing their calendars. Try using a computer instead of the phone. Utilizing the Help Desk located in the Library for assistance is also an option.
