Class Concerns

March 2019

- COG – Students would like a water filtered system by RGE. In response to this, there are two new water filter systems being installed near Liebelt and the top of Olson.
- M4 – No concerns
- P4 – No concerns
- M3 – Students are concerned about OASIS. The process is ongoing, and critical care rotations are a concern. M4s assure that the issue will work itself out
 - Students are inquiring about a 24/7 Sequoia – this is not possible and has been asked before. Sequoia was asked about extended hours some time ago and cannot justify the staffing costs to secure the space and equipment for the few number of Sequoia guests past normal hours.
- P3 – No concerns
- M2 – There have been two separate encounters with Sequoia staff for review. The anonymous submitter is encouraged to provide more details on this encounter. As a reminder, the more specific the concern is detailed in the concern form, the easier and more specifically it can be addressed.
 - Students are concerned about conference services clearing food quickly during events. Students are recommended to inform the staff of the end time of the event to prevent early clean up
 - Students are concerned with the parking lots that are far away from the NEW Center entrance compared to visitors. The visitors for Sequoia, physical therapy, and other specific services can use these spots. For students who attend Sequoia and park in the visitor spots, tickets can be refunded with the NEOMED police department
 - Students have requested for NEOMED to provide free healthy food.
- P2 – Students request a water bottle fountain near Liebelt. This is being installed.
 - Students have been using the whiteboards in the quiet section of the library for privacy rather than academic purposes
- M1 – Student submitted a concern about projected dates for updates on class profiles on the NEOMED website. NSC is unsure as to what this is. To whom this may concern, please e-mail NSC directly or submit another concern form.
 - Noise has been an issue outside of the quiet section of the library. A survey on the restructure of the library was sent out, and results will be reviewed.
 - Students expressed concern about the clarity of the minutes from the M1 Class Meeting. Details will be transparent in the synthesis of the next class meeting.
 - There have been concerns about the microphones being used in the Great Hall. They are quiet and have lots of static.
- P1 – NSC representatives would like to receive more synthesized updates from the Curriculum and Conduct Councils to be included in the newsletter
 - Student Conduct Council has addressed recent concerns with the professionalism of the students
