• **Dr. Emerick:**

Current Business – Continued

- **Due to winter break, the January NEOMED Student Council (NSC) meeting will be January 8th instead of January 1st**
 - **Student Organization Spring budget submissions will still be due on January 1st via Presence**
 - **At the January 8th NSC meeting, the council will hear event and presentation requests that occur on or after January 15th**
- **Due to spring break, the March NEOMED Student Council (NSC) meeting will be March 11th instead of March 4th**
 - **At the March 11th NSC meeting, the council will hear event and presentation requests that occur on or after March 18th**
- Recommendations from Conference Services to reduce the risk of running out of food on the buffets:
 - Conference Services will update the menus to indicate what the portion sizes are for the catered items. This way an organizer can plan their order accordingly.
 - The event organizer can decide to provide a sign at the buffet stating how much a guest can take of each item. We do this at a few student events already.
 - Conference Services can serve the items to the group for a minimal charge or the organizer can identify a staff member that can portion out the buffet for no charge. Many external groups request this to cut back on food charges.
 - A Conference Service staff member will attend every event from start to finish so if a possible problem is identified they can react immediately and resolve the issue, so we do not have to call or e-mail with concerns.
- Update re-eligibility changes for officers of NSC, Student Curriculum Council, Student Conduct Council, and Board of Trustees (BOT) student members:
 - NSC and Student Conduct Council have approved revised language to their officer eligibility
 - Revised language that further defines eligibility requirements for student members of the NEOMED Board of Trustees will remain under consideration for the future, but will not be presented to the Board of Trustees for approval at this time

Student Conduct Council Updates:

- Conduct Council members participated in a pilot role play demonstration to better understand how we might insert educational role play into the curriculum or co-curriculum. The role plays cover professionalism related conflicts and serves to provide practice for successfully managing difficult conversations when confronting professionalism concerns.
- The Council reviewed a possible "Professionalism in Practice" reward system for recognizing acts of professional behavior. Dr. Doug Moses shared the practice at his hospital so that NEOMED could revise it to fit a university setting.
- The council approved a new process for selecting college oath committee members whereby, instead of electing first years for the Oath Committee which is responsible for writing their class oath in year 3 and 4, we would instead have the Student Conduct Council officers (2 members) join two rising third years (by election in the spring of their second year) to create the four-member Oath Committee for each college.
- Conduct Council is reviewing new language in their constitution to address the process and rationale for removing elected officers if there are violations of professionalism that would necessitate a review of membership. The process will include reasons, a timeline, a process, and due process and would be totally student member-driven.

Class Concerns

November 2019

- COG – Students were asking where the closest water filling station to RGE is, and if one could be installed if there is not one nearby. Dale Hultch from campus operations was contacted regarding the possible installation of a new fountain.
- M4 – Students are starting into the interview season and have been discussing their calendars with medical students from other schools. They have raised concerns about the amount of time they are given in comparison and feel that their stress level is high due to the lack of time designated for interviews. This information will be passed on to the Curriculum Council representatives and Dr. Sperling. Students expressed concern that some residency transcripts were sent blank to their residency programs and this may negatively impact their interview offers. These 5 students have been contacted directly and steps were made to contact the residency programs if there were any concerns. All students were satisfied with the action taken and complete transcripts were uploaded for those students missing them.
- P4 – No concerns

- P3 – No concerns
- M2 – Students asked about the opt-out process for health insurance. They are concerned that it's more complicated for everyone to waive NEOMED coverage by showing proof of coverage rather than having students default to purchasing NEOMED coverage. The reason for defaulting to coverage is that students must be insured before entering any clinical sites as per our contract with the sites. This is why students need to opt-out/waive rather than opt-in. There is an 8-week period to opt-out if you have coverage. NEOMED will send multiple reminders to students about the enrollment or waiver process. Opting out of insurance coverage for existing students has been moved up starting March 1 to better accommodate students before the summer months. // Students have raised questions about why they can't use NSC funds to go to interviews as well as their presentations. Student funds are used in cases where they are representing the school and not just their own person which is the case in interviews.// Students are concerned that the displays outside of the NEW center rooms are not currently being used and want to know what it would cost to get these up and running again. NEOMED initially determined that the cost to run them was too high and when looking into other options, there weren't suitable alternatives at this time. This will be readdressed when there are more funds available. In the meantime, there are options to see in the study rooms online to see if they are currently in use.
- P2 – Students are concerned about the microphone sound in Liebelt. It is awful and affects quality on the recorded lectures. Administration and IT are aware of this issue and they are working on fixing it. There needs to be better quality control in the Bistro/Cafe Clark food —multiple students have found questionable substances/items in their food (a band-aid in the Café Clark salad bar, moss-looking substance in a Bistro salad). Lack of food options around campus in general (since Bistro/Clark close by 2:30pm)
- M1 – Students raised concerns about the fridge space availability in the student lounge near the bookstore. Ideas were pitched to add more fridges or possibly redo the lounge space to fit student needs. NSC discussed options to change the space and the idea of forming a committee of students to come up with a proposal including the new design of the space and ways to fund the project.
- P1 – Students inquired of printing money rolling into the next year, however, this is already the case (the \$200 you get in year 1 is your complete allocation for the 4 years). Concerns about outdated calculators was brought up to Academic services and they are looking into the issue. The possibility of live recorded lectures was brought up by students for convenience when not able to come to campus. This inquiry will be brought up to Michael Wright regarding the viability of it.
