- **SCC Updates:**

- There is a Step 2 Prep course in development. There will be more information given to the M2s during ACM and upcoming class meetings.
- Student Representative Names and Contact info were added to the Home page of AIMS. There is a clickable link on that page.
- The M3/M4 absence policy was discussed. It was recommended that there be further discussion in the faculty curriculum committees.
- P4 rotation concerns were discussed. There seemed to be a difficulty in communication between the faculty and the students. There is a meeting during P2 to allay some of these concerns and provide more information.
- M3 schedule meetings and the information about students who transfer in for M3 were brought up. These students fill slots very late in the scheduling process that are vacant because of M2s that do not matriculate to M3. NEOMED students are given preference for scheduling initially.
- An M1/M2 task force was convened to investigate the issue of inconsistency between PDL sites, and more information will be available by the end of the year.
- For P2s, the most recent Wasson component had a sequestered period where students were not allowed on technology. This was discussed and will be communicated more clearly in the next email concerning CSAs.
- Team based learning in M1 PBM was discussed. Some students wished to be able to take notes during the sessions. A proposal is being prepared for the new way TBL could be conducted, similar to the P1 TBL.
- Concerns were raised regarding communication between lecturers and students during MTC lectures. Assessment of lecture effectiveness is on the way.
- In regards to the matter about which there was a recent forum, the Curriculum Management and Assessment Committee (CMAC) discussed the technical standards in regards to altering them. The policy change discussion will be picked up nearer to the beginning of the next academic year.

Class Concerns

February 2018

- Advisor Updates –
 - Student concern form is checked and forwarded to the proper person once a week and the ‘Ask and Answer’ newsletter will go out every month from now on from Dr. Emerick. This list will not be exhaustive and will only concern issues relevant to the general student body.
 - Cleaning wipes now standard around GE Commons; students responsible for cleaning rooms after they leave.
 - Zoom presentations will be encouraged for students who cannot attend NSC meetings in order to request funding; updates will be included in future NSC funding reminder emails.
 - Board of trustees call for nominations; deadline is 2/23; five nominations will be selected and sent to the governor’s office for a final decision; term begins 7/1 and lasts 2 years.
 - 3 NSC representatives are asked to be designated drivers for the commencement ball evening
 - Student org.’s have been reminded about the process of training new student org. leaders; email was sent to all current student org. leaders.
 - Per agreement, the Body and Beyond health fair will receive the \$2,000 donation from NSC for cholesterol strips.
- COG – Concerns with some classes (e.g. PDI); COG students who wrote papers did not receive instructor feedback; professors did not return emails; PBM exams are the same for COG and M1’s, but passing grade is 80 for COG, but 70 for M1’s, where some COG students do not have background in medicine; concern should be brought up with course director; AIMS site does not reflect classes currently offered at NEOMED.

- M3 – Students concerned with how to determine whether printing money had been added to account; wish to see account balance over time.
- P3 – None.
- M2 –
 - Discussion of petition; Advised to acknowledge that there are two sides to each story, but the school’s side is confidential, so it will remain a one-sided story. Further discussion regarding NEOMED identity and fixable issues were brought to light and will continue to be discussed in the appropriate setting.
 - Students concerned with being identified based on their responses on the ISA; survey was not anonymous, but is confidential; students are de-identified, so student impact committee members performing data-analysis and generating reports do not have access to who responds in what way.
 - Concerns over student fees for Sequoia for all students; matter is being addressed and responses are being processed; students with concerns are encouraged to attend meetings with Mr. John Wray; concerns about reserving the gym for a block of time; time of concern is 8-10 p.m.; issue is focused on students being removed who have reserved a time; Sequoia is going to be reached out to regarding reserving this time and clarification on the issue.
